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93170 Fitting Instructions for B5 EFI

Your 2 Generic Givi Pannier Frame Fixing Kits contain more parts than needed and also some substitute parts in stainless from Hitchcocks. Parts required are:

- 2 3/8" x 2" Long Bolts for Rear Shock Absorbers
- 2 x 3/8" BSF Nyloc Nuts for Rear Shock Absorber Bolts
- 4 3/8" Flat Washers Stainless for Rear Shock Absorbers
- 4 x Q Clips
- 4 M8 x 20mm Q Clip Bolts
- 8 5/16" Flat Washers Stainless for Q Clips
- 4 M8 x 1.25 Nyloc Nuts Stainless for Q Clips
- 4 6mm Nyloc Nuts Stainless (Replaces Black Nuts in Kit)
- 4 M6 x 15mm Hex Socket Screws Stainless


Countersunk (Replaces Black Screws in Kit)

- 2 x Pannier Frames for Givi Side Bags
- 2 x Generic Givi Pannier Frame Fixing Kits (caution 4 small plastic anti-theft plugs contained in bag for lock screw tops)

Check what sort of rear suspension top bolts you have. If they're still the originals, they won't be long enough and may also be pointing outwards, which will mean hinging the rear mudguard up to allow enough room to withdraw them. The fitting kit includes two longer suspension bolts, nuts and washers to replace them.

Before attempting to fit the racks to your bike, it will be necessary to install the pannier rack fixing kit, as illustrated (note for the lower rack bolts we supply alternative thin 6 mm stainless nyloc nuts which are a better fit than the black ones in the Givi kit). The top bracket eye bolt is already fitted.









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
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When you've finished assembling the racks each one should look like this:

Don't forget the rubber buffers



The lower rack bolts should be fitted like this. The spacer faces outwards:



... and the Q Clips!

The pannier box fits onto the rack like this:

Drop the pannier box down onto the lower spacers first . . .

When completed it should now looks like this:



... then push the upper part of the pannier box towards the top locking latch. It should click into position.
